MUSEUM OPENS LAVERNE PARRISH BUILDING

The Rocky Mountain Museum of Military History opened its main exhibit building on Memorial Day 2003, as Fort Missoula's Building T-316 was rededicated as the T/4 Laverne Parrish Building.

Many local veterans were on hand as former state Senator Mike Halligan provided the keynote address; the assembly was told that their efforts had made the RMMM's opening possible. John C. Moe and Ed Mosier raised the U.S. flag for the first time in many years over the building; both men had been stationed at Fort Missoula during their careers. Pauline Gordon cut the entrance ribbon, and the public then got its first look at the premiere exhibit "The Ultimate Sacrifice: Montanans in Battle".

The building is named for Laverne Parrish, who was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for his service as a medic in the Philippine Campaign in 1944.

About a quarter of the building is now open to the public, including the former drill hall, front hallway, and the director's office. Work is continuing this winter on a second exhibit hall.

Both buildings on the Museum grounds, T-310 and T-316, will be open 12-5 Saturdays and Sundays through June 1

RMMM DEDICATES SVOBODA HALL

Friends and supporters of the Museum gathered at the Parrish Building on September 14 to dedicate the former drill hall as the Robert A. Svoboda Exhibition Hall.

Svoboda, a Lewiston native, served in the U.S. Navy during World War II, then returned to Montana to attend the UM. He met his wife Jean while in Missoula, and then went on to a successful business career in financial services in both Montana and California. He amassed substantial collections of Montana memorabilia and papers from the territorial and early statehood periods, and in 2002 generously donated one of his compilations to the RMMM. The donation included several original documents from Fort Missoula.

Svoboda and his wife both attended the dedication, where he noted that his last name is a synonym in the Czech language for "Liberty", making it a perfect fit for the tenor of the hall's exhibits. He also expressed the hope that the hall would serve an educational purpose for younger generations.

Photos of Svoboda and samples of his collection are on display next to the Laverne Parrish case.

RMMMh RECEIVES NEW GRANT FROM GALLAGHER FOUNDATION

Museum President M.Y. "Bo" Foster announced in September that the Museum had been awarded a \$6000 grant from the William and Rosemary Gallagher Foundation, to be applied toward the continued restoration of the Laverne Parrish Building.

The Gallaghers were long-time residents of Missoula and prominent members of the business community; Rosemary Gallagher gave the RMMMh one of its first "seed" grants in 1998.

Dennis Gordon, superintendent of the restoration and an RMMMh Board member, said the grant would be used for stabilization of the building's foundation, the installation of water service, and the expansion of exhibit space with a projected completion of the next restoration phase by Spring 2004.

On a very hot August Sunday many friends of RMMMh President M.Y. "Bo" Foster gathered at Building 30 on Officers Row at Fort Missoula to dedicate the structure to him for his many years of military and civic service.

Speaking at the former Commanding Officer's Quarters were Pete Vann, Col. Sam Roberts, and Northern Rockies Heritage Center (NHRC) Administrator Jim Azzara.

Among other highlights of Foster's career noted were his service with the U.S. 36th Division in Italy during World War II and his tenure as State Assistant Adjutant General of the Montana National Guard.

A plaque installed by the NRHC on the front of the building discusses Foster's career, and will be a worthy appreciation for future Fort visitors to view.

Book reviews

Looking for a special gift for someone? These make great gifts!

They Came to Destroy America: The FBI Goes To War Against Nazi Spies and Saboteurs Before and During World War II, Pictorial Histories Publishing, 2003, 166 pp., \$16.95.

Stan Cohen's latest book, written in cooperation with Don DeNevi and Richard Gay, looks at the attempted espionage operations of Nazi Germany on U.S. soil during WW II.

Operations Pastorius and Magpie managed to put several German agents ashore in 1942 and 1944; fortunately they were apprehended before they could do any damage to the U.S. war effort. Cohen was able to interview John Cullen, the U.S. Coast Guardsman who initially intercepted the German landing party on Long Island, as well as other participants.

As an aside the much-forgotten German-American Bund is also examined; this was the pro-Nazi organization of German-Americans which was active before the U.S. entered WW II.

Prints in the Sand: The U.S. Coast Guard Beach Patrol During World War II, PHP, 1989, 82 pp., \$9.95.

An excellent companion volume for the above-mentioned book. Eleanor C. Bishop, recalls the U.S. Coast Guard organization that patrolled the nation's periphery during WW II.

Several thousand servicemen were assigned to watch and intercept unauthorized landings by sea, and performed their duties by foot, horseback, jeep, and picket boat.

Bishop includes many period photographs and individual profiles of the regional Coast Guard operations. Both books and many other titles are available at the RMMMh gift counter. Shipping and handling fee- \$5.00
